

Cemeteries of Moretown

Belding- A small originally private cemetery located in Moretown on Route 100, 3/10 of a mile north of junction of 100 and 100B. Eight graves, the earliest burial William Belding-1844
Status-Non active

Cobb- Reported to be a cemetery that was plowed up to make farm land. One stone and one marker standing. Sarah Cobb-1815 Wife of Silas Cobb, also presumed to be a child buried in same location. On private land off Rt. 100B.
Status-Non active

Fairmont- Also known as Hazelton. Located in North Moretown on Rt. 2 just out of Waterbury. Sixty graves the earliest burial, Paul Knapp- 1794.
Status-Active

Hawkes-Eaton- Just off Rt. 100B. Sits high on a knoll. Private on private land. Six graves, the earliest burial- Ruben Hawkes 1841.
Status- Non active



Jones Brook- Located on the right (west) side of Jones Brook Rd., off Center Rd. Twenty five graves, the earliest burial Alexander Ambrose- 1843
Status-Non active



Moretown Common- Located on the Moretown Common Rd, just east of the 4 corners. This was once a private cemetery. Now active. Too hundred graves, earliest stone marker, Jenny Stowell- 1792. First burial reported in 1807.
Status- Active

Mountain View- Located off Rt. 100B on Freeman Hill Road. Turn directly across from Village Cemetery. This is the newest of cemeteries and the most active. Earliest burials in 1956.
Status- Active

St. Patrick's- This cemetery is not maintained by the Town but by the Catholic Dioceses. Known as the "Irish Cemetery" it is located on the east side of South Hill on Moretown Mountain Rd. There are about one hundred and fifty graves and it appears the earliest burial was in 1833. At one time the Catholic Church was located on this plot.
Status- Unknown

Stevens- Private family cemetery established in 1907. On the west side of Rt.100B at the junction of Stevens Brook Rd. Less than four graves known.
Status-Non active



Village Cemetery- Located on the east side of Rt. 100B a little south of the village. Once known as Riverview it contains 275 graves. Earliest burial Rufus Clapp- 1810
Status-Active
